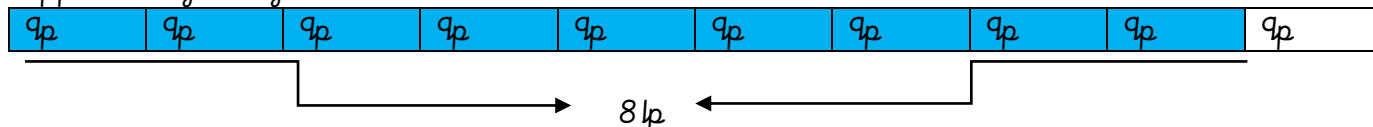

We will further our work on calculating with fractions, applying them to real life situations. We will be delving into the world of decimals and percentages and examining and explaining the link between them. It would be great if you could ask them to calculate % discounts in shops. For example, if a coat was £30 yet now has 20% off, how much is the coat now? Or for greater challenge: A bag of apples is now 81p after being reduced by 10%. How much was the bag of apples originally?



### PE

The children will have PE on a Thursday and Friday, although they will need their P.E. kit in school at all times just in case our sessions need to change day. During the first half term, it would be beneficial for the children to have both shorts and tracksuit bottoms in their P.E kit: Shorts for Dance/ Gym work and tracksuit bottoms for outside games.
